A unique feature of Epsilon Camp is apartment-style housing on campus for each family; at least one parent must attend with each child. Space is limited.

==> Epsilon Camp has also announced a new camp for similar students who are 6.5 to not yet 9 years old. Called Delta Camp, it will admit only 12 students in 2014. Delta Camp will run concurrently with Epsilon Camp.
